# Age-Friendly Thunder Bay Transportation Working Group

## Vision

All older adults in Thunder Bay have affordable and safe access to different modes of transportation.

## **Mission**

To facilitate a collaborative process among community members, community leaders and other key stakeholders to develop strategic directions for issues around transportation that affect older adults in Thunder Bay.

## **Background**

We have come together from the recommendations developed from the Age Friendly Thunder Bay Community Wide Action Plan (2017) to coordinate specific actions that will help to create affordable and safe access to different modes of transportation for all older adults in Thunder Bay.

### Goals

The Working Group will work collectively to ensure that the workplan goals are met, and new goals may be added to the workplan during the year, if necessary.

## **Membership and Structure**

Membership is open to any Age-Friendly steering committee member, organization/professional, or community member who is interested in transportation and older adults in Thunder Bay. The Working Group will be open to organizations and individuals that support our Vision, Mission and Goals. We will operate via the following terms:

## **Meeting Frequency**

Zoom meetings will be held the first Thursday of every month, except for July and August.

Annual calendar invitations will be sent to all working group members before the start of the year.

Email invitations will be sent out a day or so before each meeting. Additional meetings may be called if additional external funding and project opportunities arise.

## **Decision Making**

Decision making should reflect the needs of the general membership and the guiding principles of Age Friendly Thunder Bay.

Decision making processes will strive to enable participants to express their needs and share their solutions and visions through an environment that encourages transparency, mutual respect, collective input, and trust.

# **Spokespeople**

The Chair and/or Vice Chair of Age-Friendly Thunder Bay will act as the spokespeople for the Working Group (at events, for media interviews, for presentations, deputations or when meetings with government officials and politicians occur)

- All correspondence from the Working Group must be first sent to the Coordinator and/or Board representative for review.
- All correspondence from the Working Group must be approved by the Board of Directors before sending.
- All members of the Working Group must have the opportunity to review all correspondence sent from the committee.
- All correspondence from the Working Group must be sent on Age Friendly Thunder Bay letterhead in full colour.
- On occasion, and as decided by the Board of Directors, a Working Group lead may act as a spokesperson.
- Other spokespeople may be designated by the Board of Directors as needed.

#### **Role of the Coordinator**

- Facilitating the meetings
- Create meeting agenda and send out to working group members
- Take meeting minutes and send out within 7 days of meeting
- Representing and report at Board meetings and Steering Committee meeting
- Present information at the Working Group meetings
- Participate actively in the Working Group, and provide expertise and contribute to its work
- Oversee and monitor the implementation of the Working Group and its work plan.
- Fully implement the work plan in accordance with the objectives, available budget and established time frames
- Liaise with the community partners and community members
- Collaborate to ensure that the Strategy's work plan can be implemented
- Monitor and track the progress of the work plan
- Develop, co-ordinate and deliver presentations, as required
- Respond to requests from the community and community partners
- Facilitate the development and implementation of the new or adapted initiatives
- Ensure ongoing and effective internal and external communication

# **Working Group Principles**

At Working Group meetings...

- we will strive to treat one another with respect.
- we understand that the resources and the capacity of member organizations vary greatly.
- we understand that, beyond the work of the Working Group, the member organizations employ a range of work some work closely with government, while others seek to push for policy change from outside government and we appreciate that our strength comes from this collaborative diversity (the only exception being that the Working Group will only support actions and groups that are non-violent).
- we respect the various and different parameters, mandates, capacity and resources of the member groups.
- we will remain non-partisan and constructive.

## **Decision-Making Process for the Working Group**

- A consensus decision-making model shall be used for decisions pertaining to the work of the Working Group, with votes taken only when necessary.
- The need for upcoming decisions will be circulated in the agenda two weeks prior to the meeting at which the decision will be made. These decisions shall not be re-opened at future meetings. However, members may ask for clarification of the decisions, and with new information decisions may need to be revisited.

- Decisions made at meetings on topics that are added to the agenda after the circulation of the agenda may be re-opened for further discussion and/or decision.
- Decisions can be sought via email to the Working Group members. The timeline of the decision shall be highlighted within the email, allowing at least 10 working days for adequate consideration. To replicate the open discussion of a meeting as far as possible, members should reply to all in their email. A majority vote of the Working Group members shall determine a decision.

#### **Process of endorsement**

• The Age Friendly Board of Directors will, from time to time, be asked to endorse/support various public forums, events, marches, and open letters/statements.
