Trespass to Property Act

Information from the Ontario North Family Council Network (ONFCN)

The members of the Ontario North Family Council Network (ONFCN) have been made aware of instances when residents in long term care facilities have been denied visitors, especially during the Covid crisis.

Thanks to the work of Maria Sardalis with the Access to Seniors and Disabled group and Thunder Bay Superior North NDP MPP Lise Vaugeois, the Trespass to Property Act as it relates to occupants of retirement homes, long-term care homes, and other congregated-care accommodations has been clarified.

Below is information provided be Maria Sardalis on the issue. We hope that residents and family members of residents mentioned in the residences above use this information if they find that they are being denied visiting rights.

Trespass to Property Act (TPA).

The TPA is well written, well interpreted and administered by our courts.

However, police enforcement is in opposition to the limited scope and intent of the TPA and not in accordance with our TPA courts' rulings.

The Act enumerates two grounds for trespass:

A person is not the invited guest of the 'occupier', or

The person does not have legally conferred authority to enter the home of the occupier such as persons with legally conferred authority including Power of Attorney (POA), Substitute Decision Maker (SDM) or Legal Guardian.

The first paragraph of the TPA provides the framework for the Act and defines the 'occupier' as the person in physical possession of the property (i.e. the room that the resident is paying for).

Our courts have been clear, the occupier (resident) has the sole authority to issue trespass.

Nowhere in the Act is deed possession or facility operator an authority to issue trespass, and our courts' rulings concur.

The Trespass to Property Act does not permit the facility operator to issue trespass notices to exclude substitute decision-makers and guests of the occupants of retirement homes, long-term care homes, and other congregated-care accommodations when they raise concerns about their loved ones' living conditions.




